

CRANBURY COLLEGE - KEY STAGE 3 PHASE

KS3 at Cranbury College provides education for years 7, 8 and 9.

The KS3 team endeavour to find an appropriate pathway for each individual student. Whether this is a trial at a new mainstream school, a specialist school or a bespoke timetable at Cranbury, each student will receive individual intervention and support to enable them to thrive and succeed in an environment that suits them. Regular reviews are completed alongside parents and other professionals, to ensure that each student is being given the tools and opportunity to reach their potential.

To enable change in behaviour, and confidence in learning, the college offers a holistic child-centred curriculum, based on the Core Subjects (English, Maths, PSHE, Science and IT) plus additional subjects such as Art, Humanities, Food Technology and ASDAN.

In addition to this, students can access a variety of offsite activities via different external providers. These include

- RAW Gym and Mentoring
- Auto Skills
- Reading Football Club
- Hair and Beauty

On a weekly basis, Key Stage 3 engage in an Enrichment Day which provides all students with a variety of activities and experiences to consolidate and enhance their learning at Cranbury College. The KS3 team are passionate about increasing the cultural capital of each child to create well rounded and informed individuals who have had access to a broad range of opportunities outside of their everyday life.

Enrichment Days have a focus on the following areas:

- Communication and Language
- Physical Development
- Personal, Social and Emotional Development
- Problem Solving
- Building confidence and self-esteem

Within our Key Stage 3 offer, we also provide a respite programme for young people who are struggling with certain aspects of their mainstream education. This is usually a 6-week placement with the referral being completed by the school. The aim of this, is that it gives the young person a chance to have a break from their setting to focus on the challenges they face, and work with Cranbury staff to overcome these difficulties, with the view of reintegrating successfully back into their mainstream school. As part of this, Cranbury staff will complete observations and a report of recommendations for the school, to enable that young person to have the best chance at succeeding on their return.

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
