

## REF Y10 Mock Exams March 2023

Dear Parent/Carer

At Cranbury College we want to ensure that your child is fully prepared for their exams at the end of Y11 and we hope that you will fully support us in delivering successful mock examination periods in the lead up to Summer 2024.

All these examinations will provide us with information to ascertain whether your child will be following the GCSE path or whether it would be more conducive to head them towards a different type of qualification. All entries made next year will be discussed with you during parent meetings and also be dependent on your child's attendance at Cranbury College between now and then.

Mock exams will take place on site at Cranbury College as follows;

Date	Time	Subject
Tuesday 7 March	12:45	GCSE English Language Step Up to English
Wednesday 8 March	12:45	GCSE Science (Physics – Higher or Foundation Tier)
Thursday 9 March	12:45	GCSE Maths (Higher or Foundation Tier) ELC Maths

A full timetable for your child, including roomings, will be released via email to you nearer the time.


These mock exams will also ensure that your child fully understands the formal JCQ examination regulations, and how external exams will run at Cranbury College.

- Students must remain in silence at all times in the examination rooms, and must not attempt to communicate with any other student
- Students must hand in at reception before the examination starts any electronic devices - this includes mobile phones, headphones, and watches
- Students must only have a transparent water bottle.
- Students do not need to bring their own equipment as this will be provided by Cranbury College
- Students must leave all their belongings at reception.

Students not following the rules during any external examination must be reported to the examination boards. This can lead to being disqualified and not receiving a grade. It is important that students experience the same conditions during mock examinations, so they are familiar with them, and gain confidence and resilience whilst facing some relatively long papers.

Students will be provided with a packed lunch on arrival and released from school at the end of their examination.
