### **SEN at Cranbury**


Year 11 annual reviews are underway ready for post-16 next steps.

# **Re-Engagement Intervention Workshops**

The Re-Engagement intervention workshops will be starting at Cranbury Road from Monday 30 November 2023.

These workshops offer targeted interventions to a small group of students from mainstream settings, who need some additional support. The workshops will give the students opportunities to be able to reflect and learn support strategies to improve their outcomes and build upon their skills to enable them to be successful on their return to their mainstream school.

There are three packages that are delivered in six-week blocks, where each student will receive two 45-minute sessions on a weekly basis. The schools can choose from one of the following packages:

- Package Two: Healthy Relationships & Re-Engagement
- Package Three: Conflict Management & Risk Taking


## **Hospital Team Update**

### **SAFE Team Update**

There have been lots of changes this academic year that both students and staff are embracing!

We have changed our student entrance to allow for a calmer reception area for visitors. We have introduced a uniform which looks really smart, and students can choose to wear either a white polo shirt with a logo, a black sweatshirt with a logo or both!! We are also working hard to ensure that mobile phones are away during lessons to prevent loss of valuable learning time.

We also have kitted out our student common room (formerly the hall) for students to use at break and lunch time with a sofa, beanbags, football tables, magnetic darts and some new pool equipment.

All these changes are having a positive impact on the smooth running of the day and on creating a positive learning environment. It's wonderful to see how quickly the students have adapted to all the changes.

Our Positive Points system continues to work well with students earning points for doing well in the following categories: Ready To Learn/ Be Respectful/ Be Safe and there is also a community category for students who do kind things around the school grounds like pick up litter or help paint/ fix something and make the school community nice. I'm sure those of you who have visited so far this year have noticed how much better the inside of the building looks. The YR 9 students helped to paint the meeting room last week and it looks amazing! Winners of the Gold/ Silver/Bronze weekly awards win a certificate and a voucher.

We have been working closely with our mainstream partners to offer Fresh Start trials to our students and we currently have 2 YR 11s on trials/ one successfully on roll and 5 more students working towards their next step. We couldn't do this without the kindness and support of our local schools.

### **Attendance**

We welcomed our students back to school in September with a new attendance challenge for each of our tutor groups – which tutor group could get the highest attendance percentage each week?

This has encouraged our students to not only become competitive but to reflect on their own attendance percentage and focus on the link between the higher their percentage, the more learning that has been received and the impact this can have on their future.

If your child has an attendance percentage of below 90% they are classified as being persistently absent due to the significant loss in learning.

#### Did you know?

90% Attendance = ½ day missed every week

90% Attendance in one school year = 4 weeks of lessons missed

90% Attendance over 5 school years = ½ school year missed

### **Support for Students**

Lucy will work with several of our students in a variety of techniques and methods to help guide them when solving problems, building resilience and supporting them to remove barriers that are preventing them from being successful both in and out of school.

This service forms part of a large range of interventions that we offer our students at Cranbury College and we are sure our students will continue to thrive in her sessions.



# Support for Local Schools

One of our roles at Cranbury College is to support schools in the local area with advice and guidance to avoid Permanent Exclusion for their students.

As part of our offer, we now provide workshops for schools on Anger Management, School Expectations, Healthy Relationships, Conflict Management and Risk Taking (as detailed above)

We have also recently introduced 'Behaviour Clinics' for schools to discuss concerns they have and receive timely and informed advice about suitable alternatives to suspension and permanent exclusion.

### **Personal Development**

We are excited to welcome Narrative Alchemy to Cranbury College on Friday 20th October to deliver a performance to our Key Stage Three students called 'Breaking the Chain'. This session will focus on Knife Crime and forms part of our Personal Development Programme – ensuring our students receive a full curriculum that endeavours to work on the whole individual.

Our students also focussed their thoughts to 'World Mental Health Day' on Tuesday 10 October with the task of 'What's on your mind?'. During tutor time, our students reflected on what is meant by the term 'Mental Health' and reflected upon what impacted their own mental health.

We thank our students for being open and mature with this delicate topic.

### **Student Pathways**

This academic year, we introduced a range of pathways to Cranbury College to ensure that all our students have access to a timetable that is appropriate and allows them to achieve their best potential.
