Extraordinary INSET Day — Friday 4 April 2025

We are writing to announce that Maiden Erlegh Trust (MET) is introducing a new platform, **Class Charts**, across all our schools after the Easter break. Class Charts is an intuitive system that will add value to our schools and our parents and carers alike. It will streamline the management of attendance, behaviour, and homework, and will allow parents and carers to view attendance and behaviour data for their child and monitor set homework.

Class Charts has already been successfully implemented at Maiden Erlegh School in Reading, where it has:

- Simplified the management of attendance, behaviour, and homework
- Improved consistency and communication across the school
- Provided parents and carers with easy access to key information about their child

To ensure a smooth transition and to allow all staff to receive comprehensive Class Charts training, **Friday 4 April 2025 has been designated as an extraordinary INSET day across all MET schools.** This means that all schools, including Maiden Erlegh School in Reading, will be closed to children on this day.

Class Charts will go live on **Tuesday 22 April 2025**. We will write to you again closer to this time to confirm how to access Class Charts, and children will receive support in accessing it after the Easter break.
